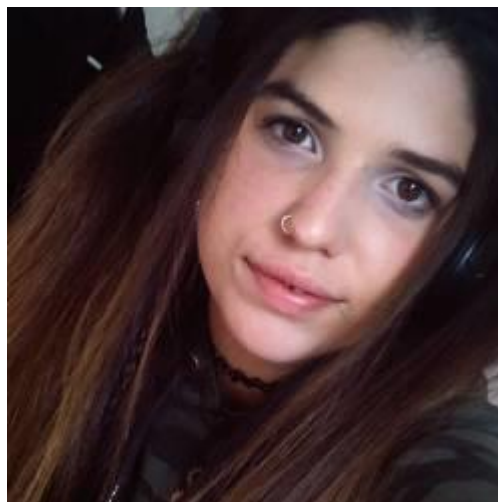


Hi! My name is Paloma, I'm 23 years old and I am an EVS in the TV Ungdom in Brønderslev. I am from Granada, Spain.

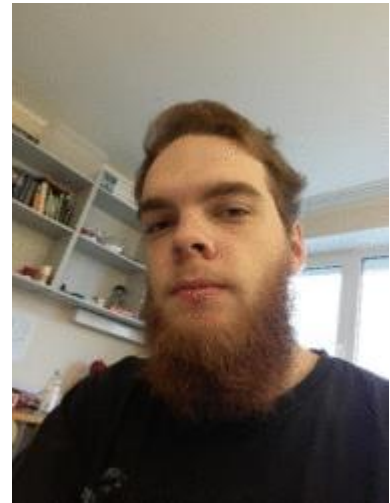
I am really looking forward to the next ten months with new experiences, friends and impressions in a nice country.
